What is apocalyptic fiction?

At the time, the armaments available to the world's various air forces were not powerful enough to produce such a result. Apocalyptic and post-apocalyptic fiction is a subgenre of science fiction in which the Earth's (or another planet's) civilization is collapsing or has collapsed.

Is apocalyptic fiction the same as dystopian fiction?

Apocalyptic fiction is not the same as fiction that provides visions of a dystopian future. George Orwell's *Nineteen Eighty-Four*, for example, is dystopian fiction, not apocalyptic fiction. Towards the end of the book the Time Traveler witnesses the Sun's expansion, causing the death of all life on Earth.

What is an apocalypse novel about?

This novel includes one of the stranger epidemics in apocalypse fiction: the Forgetting, which has devastated the world by separating those afflicted from their shadows--and their memories, which causes them to behave erratically, even violently. As society breaks down, Ory and Max (one shadowless, one not) try to find answers, and each other.

What is post-apocalyptic fiction?

Post-apocalyptic fiction is set in a world or civilization after such a disaster. The time frame may be immediately after the catastrophe, focusing on the travails or psychology of survivors, or considerably later, often including the theme that the existence of pre-catastrophe civilization has been forgotten (or mythologized).

What is a post-apocalyptic world?

It is credited with creating the post-apocalyptic manga and anime genre, depicting its post-apocalyptic world as a desert wasteland with biker gangs, anarchic violence, ruined buildings, innocent civilians, tribal chiefs and small abandoned villages.

Which books have a post-apocalyptic theme?

H.G. Wells wrote several novels that have a post-apocalyptic theme. *The Time Machine* (1895) has the unnamed protagonist traveling to the year 802,701 A.D. after civilization has collapsed and humanity has split into two distinct species, the elfin Eloi and the brutal Morlocks.
