

# Can I get change at lockers in Japan

What if I don't get a change in a locker?

If you find yourself without change, some lockers may have change machines nearby. Note that these machines usually do not accept 5,000 or 10,000 yen bills, rather are designed for exchanging 1,000 yen bills and 500 yen coins for 100 yen coins.

Are coin lockers a good idea in Japan?

Coin lockers are highly convenient if you want to explore a few hours before you head to your next destination! At coin lockers, you can store your luggage like a suitcase or a backpack. You can expect them at major train stations in Japan, and you may also find them at train stations in smaller tourist towns.

How much does a coin locker cost in Japan?

The cost of a coin locker in Japan is usually between 400 yen and 700 yen. (That is less than US\$4 to less than US\$7.) It will depend on how big of a locker you get. But I've seen coin lockers at a lot of different stations in Japan, most recently at several train stations in fall 2022, and they do seem to all be the same price.

Do train stations in Japan have coin lockers?

You will find that train stations all over Japan have coin lockers. Coin lockers are highly convenient if you want to explore a few hours before you head to your next destination! At coin lockers, you can store your luggage like a suitcase or a backpack.

Where can I get money change in Tokyo?

Usually you'll find money change machines next to coin lockers that will help you get small change of 100 yen coins. However, these machines only accept 500 yen coins and 1000 yen bills. Tip: If you need change and don't find any money change machine in the locker room, you can get your change from nearby vending machines by buying a drink.

Do coin lockers allow overnight storage in Japan?

In general, most coin lockers in Japan don't allow overnight storage. Coin lockers are something to be used while you are out and about during the day. Some train stations do have a closing time, so if you think you'll be out into the evening (and even if not just in case!) look around for a posted sign that indicates hours.

When change machines aren't available, try buying a drink from a vending machine to break a bill. Keyless touch panel lockers may also accept 1,000 yen notes directly. Exceeding your paid storage time means additional ...

All major train stations in Japan, and most minor stations, have coin lockers available to use. Coin lockers are a part of daily life in Japan, and they can be found also on bus terminals, shopping centers or department stores, some ...

You can check the availability of more than 5,000 coin lockers in the station on the "Locker Concierge" website, so you can get a rough idea of where to go. The cost is around 400 to 800 yen, depending on the size of the ...

The words?1?????, translated to "1-Day ?? Yen" indicates the daily usage fee for each coin locker. Note that prices displayed are not for 24 hour use but up till the time of day ...

Coin lockers can be found at pretty much any station in Tokyo, usually installed just next to ticket gates and underground passages, but also near busy streets and department stores. The only problem is: the coin ...
