



# Djibouti power energy solar

Will AMEA power build a solar PV plant in Djibouti?

UAE-based independent power producer (IPP) Amea Power has signed agreements to build a 30 MWp solar PV plant in Djibouti. This will be done in the framework of a public-private partnership (PPP). Amea Power continues its expansion in Africa.

Why is Djibouti constructing a solar farm?

Djibouti's \$390 million solar farm is under construction in southern Djibouti as a result of a public-private partnership between Djibouti's Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources and Green Enesys, a German renewable energy firm. Construction began in 2018 after \$50 million in funding was secured by the World Bank and other financiers.

Where does Djibouti's energy come from?

Most of Djibouti's energy supply, around 80%, is sourced from neighboring Ethiopia. At the end of 2023, Djibouti was among the select few countries throughout the world that had yet to install any PV capacity, according to the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA).

Does Djibouti have geothermal power?

Djibouti currently has just over 100 MW of installed generation capacity, but only 57 MW is reliably available to serve a population of 940,000 and its key industries. Geothermal resources in Djibouti have been recognized for years, and exploration activities are currently underway to identify economic vapor resources.

How many people in Djibouti have electricity?

In Djibouti, only 60 percent of the population has access to electricity. There is a large disparity in access between urban and rural areas, with far more city dwellers connected to the grid than those in rural areas. Therefore, approximately 490,000 people in Djibouti do not have electricity.

What does AMEA power do in Djibouti?

AMEA Power will develop the project in partnership with the Sovereign Wealth Fund of Djibouti (FSD). The electricity produced will be sold to Djibouti's public utility, Électricité de Djibouti (EDD), under a long-term power purchase agreement.

In line with Djibouti's plan to become energy independent, French firm Blue Shark Power is developing a 120-MW tidal power project. Several hundred megawatts of wind, solar geothermal and biomass capacity are planned to go online within 10 years.

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The Public-Private Infrastructure Advisory Facility (PPIAF) supported a pre-feasibility study to explore potential private sector participation options for the supply of electricity to rural villages in Djibouti using small-scale mini-grids solar schemes. The pre-feasibility analysis found that a build-operate-transfer concession model would not be financially viable due to the small scale.

The solar power plant is expected to contribute significantly to Djibouti's energy mix, providing cleaner energy and reducing reliance on fossil fuels. As both nations face the challenges of climate change and energy demand, this project exemplifies their commitment to sustainable practices and the transition to greener energy sources.
