UAE-based independent power producer (IPP) Amea Power has signed agreements to build a 30 MWp solar PV plant in Djibouti. This will be done in the framework of a public-private partnership (PPP). Amea Power continues its expansion in Africa.

Dubai-based AMEA Power has secured a 25-year PPA from Djibouti's state-owned utility, Electricit  de Djibouti (EDD), for a 25 MW solar-plus-storage plant it plans to build in Grand Bara, south of the national capital. The solar plant is the country's first IPP project and will be developed under a BOOT model.

The Djiboutian government has approved and validated the Grand Bara solar photovoltaic power project in the Council of Ministers meeting held on 18 May 2020. The approval was based on the adoption of a preliminary assessment that aims to materialize the completion of the construction project. AMEA Djibouti Solar PV Park is a 30MW solar PV power project. It is planned in Djibouti. According to GlobalData, who tracks and profiles over 170,000 power plants worldwide, the project is currently at the permitting stage. It will be developed in a single phase.

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How Djibouti will produce 100% green energy by 2035. In September 2023, Djibouti inaugurated its first wind farm in the north of the country. 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The agreement concerns the construction of a 30 MW photovoltaic solar power plant. The solar power plant is part of a much larger project: the construction of a 300 MW solar complex. The overall investment is expected to amount to EUR360 million. It is an important project that is undergoing some changes and is keeping Djiboutians on the alert.

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
