#### Are 'free solar panel health checks' a scam?

We're regularly contacted by customers, who have received an unsolicited call or letter from another company, offering them a 'free solar panel health check' or warning about their solar PV system being at risk of failing. This is a common scam.

#### Is going solar a scam?

It's likely a scam. While there are some government-funded solar programs for households that qualify,"going solar" isn't free. Honest businesses will tell you exactly how much it'll cost to get and install solar panels. Here's how to steer clear of the scams: Do some research.

#### Are solar panels free?

As far as actual free solar panels go, there are some small programs in places, like the Solar for All program in Washington D.C., geared toward low-income households that offer modestly-sized solar panel systems for free. Beware of any company asking you to make a big deposit before they have completed their installation. This is one of the most common ways 'fake' solar companies have targeted consumers - whereby they take a hefty deposit and then never turn up to carry out the installation. This is common solar scam.

## What should I do if a solar business is a scam?

Protect your personal information. Don't respond to unexpected requests online or on social media for your name, address, or other personal information to "see if you qualify." At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammers trying to steal your identity.

We"ve heard numerous reports of scam emails and websites offering cheap solar panel installation and free health checks, so do be careful. It"s important you do your research and use a reputable company before ...
