How can a merchant communicate with users on WeChat?

Merchants can communicate with users on WeChat through Official Accounts. Once a merchant has opened an Official Account and enabled the payment feature, users can pay for goods and services inside the Official Account. An Official Account is a tool for managing and understanding fans.

What is WeChat Pay?

WeChat Pay is a payment feature integrated into the WeChat app, allowing users to complete payments quickly and securely on their mobile phones. Users can link their bank cards, receive and transfer money, pay bills, and make purchases both in-store and online. Download WeChat from the App Store or Google Play.

What is a WeChat official public account?

The Wechat product designed for businesses is called the Official Public Account. There are 2 major ways business can set up Official Public Accounts: Service Account and Subscription Account (*a third kind is called Enterprise Account, it's more used for businesses' internal communications, hence less relevant in this discussion).

Is WeChat Pay better than other mobile payment systems?

WeChat has nearly 1.3 billion monthly active users, making it the second largest mobile payment giant after Alipay, and WeChat Pay accounts for 39.53% of China's mobile payment market share. How do I pay a bill on WeChat?

To pay in stores, open WeChat, go to "Wallet," tap on "QR Code for Payment," and let the cashier scan your QR code. You can also scan the store's QR code and enter the amount you need to pay.
