Is going solar a scam?

It's likely a scam. While there are some government-funded solar programs for households that qualify, "going solar" isn't free. Honest businesses will tell you exactly how much it'll cost to get and install solar panels. Here's how to steer clear of the scams: Do some research.

How does a solar installation scam work?

How the scam works: People posing as solar installers or utility employees call or come to your home and offer free solar panels through made-up government programs or incentives. Sometimes they also claim their company will cover the cost of installation by providing huge rebates.

Is installing solar panels for free a scam?

The federal government does not install residential solar panels for free; if someone is claiming otherwise, it's probably a scam. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. If someone is promising that you'll save huge amounts of money by installing solar panels, they might be exaggerating to make a sale.

Are solar companies a bait and switch scam?

This is essentially a classic bait and switch scam. A solar company uses the premise of getting 30% off solar to get homeowners to sign a lease or PPA, and then collects it for themselves. In extreme cases, solar scammers may even pose as utility or government officials trying to promote a new or unique solar program in your area.

Are solar leases and PPAs a scam?

No, not all leases and PPAs are scams. However, they seem to be a breeding ground for deceptive and predatory practices, including the old "government is paying people to go solar" scam. Related reading: Solar Leases vs. Solar Loans vs. Solar PPAs

How do you know if a solar system is a scam?

Ask for a list of satisfied customers and look at customer reviews online. Know that the government won't offer you free solar.
