

# Is it legal to rent a roof with photovoltaic panels

Can you still get solar panels if you rent a roof?

All rent-a-roof schemes which offered free panels in return for Feed-in Tariff payments are shut to new customers, but there are still solar leases that homeowners can access. Solar subscriptions also provide an alternative way for homeowners to get rooftop panels without paying an upfront cost.

Can a rent-a-roof company install solar panels?

Where an installation is owned by a rent-a-roof company, we would expect there to be a signed 'agreement' between the relevant parties, i.e. the homeowner and the rent-a-roof company, such as a lease agreement, with the homeowner agreeing to rent their roof to the company for the purposes of installing solar PV panels.

Do you still own your roof if you get solar panels?

Most households that get solar panels still own their roof, because they buy the panels outright or use a solar subscription like Sunsaver Plus, both of which allow them to maintain ownership of their roof. You can access solar roof leases which take control of your roof for a set number of years, in return for a free solar installation.

What is a solar panel rent-a-roof scheme?

The Rent-a-Roof scheme lets people who can't otherwise afford solar panels gain access to them, through installers who will set up solar panels on roofs for reduced prices. Installers can then sell any excess electricity generated back to the grid.

How many homes have a rent-a-roof solar panel scheme?

While the Feed-in Tariff was in effect, more than 900,000 homes in the UK had solar panels installed - so we can estimate that around 27,000 households signed up for a rent-a-roof scheme. What were the problems with rent-a-roof solar panel schemes?
