How much does Lesotho government contribute to solar power project?

Lesotho Government Contribution to this project is estimated at M220 million which will cover the costs of land compensations valued around M57 million, Tax obligations as well as operating costs of Lesotho Electricity Generation Company (LEGCO). The government is implementing 70MW solar electricity generation project at Ramarothole in Mafeteng.

What is ramarothole solar power project in Lesotho?

The project will be under the direct supervision of Lesotho Electricity Generation Company (LEGCO). The 70MW Ramarothole solar power project is planned to be implemented and built in two phases: Phase I: 30MWp with construction period of 18 months and Phase II: 40MWp to be completed in 2030.

Who financed 30MW solar project in Lesotho?

A Chinese based contractor SINOMA-TBEA Consortium has been engaged to construct the 30MW solar project. The project is under the direct supervision of Lesotho Electricity Generation Company (LEGCO). Phase I (30MW) of the project is financed by a soft loan from EXIM Bank of China with total contribution of USD 70.188 million.

Who is constructing a solar power plant in Lesotho?

The government has also engaged China Sinoma International Engineering and TBEA Xinjiang New Energy to construct solar power plant that will produce 70 MW. Lesotho Electricity and Water Authority (LEWA) Lesotho Electricity Company (LEC) Lesotho Highlands Development Authority (LHDA)

Who owns Lesotho electricity generation company (LegCo)?

The Lesotho Electricity Generation Company (LEGCO) is a company wholly owned by the Government of Lesotho. LEGCO was incorporated on the 29 th January 2020 as a public company under the Companies Act of 2011. It commenced its full operations on the 1 st September 2020.

Can Lesotho export wind power?

Breeze Power, a company owned jointly by GOKL and Harrison & White Investments, is investigating twelve sites for wind power generation. Energy demand is growing in South Africa and the rest of the region, and Lesotho has the potential to export renewable power.

Lesotho also has good solar energy resources with over 300 sunny days in a year with annual average insolation levels of 5.25 - 5.53 kWh/m<sup>2</sup>/year<sup>6</sup>. The country also has good wind energy resources with measured annual average wind speeds of 3.7 to 4.7 m/s/year at 10 m heights<sup>7</sup>. Renewable energy sources have the

and Lesotho was no exception. First and foremost was the inclusion in the project of an initiative to eliminate the use of dirty, dangerous, dim and expensive paraffin and candles as the main source of lighting for the entire country, some 350,000 homes.

NEO I SPV Pty Ltd., a subsidiary of OnePower Lesotho Pty Ltd., is developing a 20 MW Solar Photo Voltaic (PV) plant, the first utility-scale solar PV project in Lesotho. The power will feed into the national grid in Mafeteng Province. The Project will contribute to a strategic phase-out of costly power imports from Mozambique and to reducing reliance on imported ...

Supports Lesotho's conditional NDC (2018) target to reduce GHG emissions by 35% by 2030 and install 1MW of solar PV mini-grids in rural areas. Ha Makebe is well aligned with Lesotho's National Energy Policy (2015), which aims to increase private sector engagement in energy sector development, especially renewable energy mini-grids.
