

How much power does DR Congo have?

According to the latest figures from the International Renewable Energy Agency, DR Congo only had 20 MW of installed PV capacity at the end of 2020. The country has one of the lowest levels of access to electricity in the world, with only 9% of the population being supplied with power. This percentage in rural areas drops to as far as 1%.

What are the main sources of energy in the Congo?

Hydropower: For which the Congo River is the main source, with an average flow rate 42,000 m³/s. Biogas: Coming mainly from both plant and animal waste. Solar: The DRC has noticeably high solar radiation averaging 6 kWh/m²/day.

Could the Congo become an electricity exporter?

Almost all electricity generation today comes from hydropower and the Inga project has the potential to provide much more. If network constraints are addressed, Democratic Republic of the Congo could become an electricity exporter.

How does the Democratic Republic of the Congo support the economy?

In the AC, Democratic Republic of the Congo supports an economy six-times larger than today's with only 35% more energy by diversifying its energy mix away from one that is 95% dependent on bioenergy.

When will DR Congo's solar power plants be built?

Off Grid Solar System. An off-grid system is not connected to the electricity grid and therefore requires battery storage. Off-grid solar systems must be designed appropriately so that they will generate enough power throughout the year and have enough battery capacity to meet the home's requirements, even in the depths of winter when there is generally much less sunlight.
