Are free solar panels a scam?

Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free. If you're considering whether solar energy is right for you, check out the Department of Energy's guide for homeowners and learn more. How does a solar installation scam work?

How the scam works: People posing as solar installers or utility employees call or come to your home and offer free solar panels through made-up government programs or incentives. Sometimes they also claim their company will cover the cost of installation by providing huge rebates.

How do I know if a solar company is a scam?

Be wary of solicitors. Always verify the identity and credentials of anyone claiming to represent a solar company. Unscrupulous solar companies may employ aggressive or dishonest sales tactics to close deals quickly, especially if the proposed solar installation isn't in your best interest.

How do I protect myself from solar scams?

Protecting yourself from solar scams means taking a proactive approach and following a few key strategies. One of the most effective ways to protect yourself from solar scams is to know the average cost of solar panels in your area. By researching prices, you can identify quotes that are suspiciously high or low.

Are solar panels eco-friendly?

Solar panels offer a low-maintenance solution for sustainable energy. While harnessing solar energy is a green initiative, some people worry about the eco-friendliness of solar panel production. However, solar panels often offset the energy used in their manufacture within one to four years of operation.

Are solar business leads a scam?

At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammers trying to steal your identity. If you spot a scam, tell the Federal Trade Commission at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](https://www.ftc.gov/identitytheft).
