How can St Vincent and the Grenadines build a more resilient economy?

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has initiated and supported reforms critical to build a more resilient economy through: (i) strengthening fiscal policy and public financial management; and (ii) strengthening climate resilience and adaptation in support of blue growth by implementing key policies around fisheries and ocean development.

How can Saint Vincent and the Grenadines improve health services?

Through this project, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines will reinforce the health system's adaptive capacity to create a safe, resilient, and transparent environment for sustained health service delivery and improved hospital performance.

How will the World Bank help Saint Vincent & Grenadines?

The World Bank approved a \$51 million credit to Saint Vincent and Grenadines to modernize hospital services and build a more resilient and sustainable health infrastructure and system, including the construction of a new acute care hospital and health sector reform.

What type of government does Saint Vincent & the Grenadines have?

The legislative branch of government is the unicameral House of Assembly of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, seating 15 elected members representing single-member constituencies and six appointed members known as Senators. The parliamentary term of office is five years, although the Prime Minister may call elections at any time.

Is Saint Vincent and the Grenadines vulnerable to natural disasters?

Challenge As a small island Caribbean state, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG) is highly vulnerable to natural disasters, particularly hurricanes, and to the effects of climate change, including rising sea levels.
