

Where are the Cocos Keeling Islands?

Flip open a map of Australia, wave a magnifying glass some 2700 kilometres north-west of Perth and you'll find Cocos Keeling Islands glistening in the Indian Ocean. Look closer: 27 sand-smudged islands don't so much leap from the ocean, as lay luxuriating in blissful blue-gem waters.

Is Cocos Keeling Islands a protected area?

In March 2022, Parks Australia declared the Cocos Keeling Islands marine park a protected area. So if you swim, snorkel, or dive, marvel at the many incredible species that have clung on to survive and thrive around the healthy reefs and in deeper ocean waters. The only place in the world you can walk around an entire atoll! If you have time for a little pre-planning and a spare eight hours up your Cocos Keeling Island holiday sleeve, talk to the Visitor Centre team on West Island about how to island walk, between Islands.

Why are the Cocos Islands called the Keeling Islands?

The territory's dual name (official since the islands' incorporation into Australia in 1955) reflects that the islands have historically been known as either the Cocos Islands or the Keeling Islands. The territory consists of two atolls made up of 27 coral islands, of which only two - West Island and Home Island - are inhabited.

Where can I watch the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

It is available in paper and electronic formats. The Cocos (Keeling) Islands receives a range of digital channels from Western Australia via satellite and is broadcast from the Airport Building on the West Island on the following VHF frequencies: ABC6, SBS7, WAW8, WOW10 and WDW11

How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

All flights to the Cocos Keeling Islands land on West Island. The island exceeds 10 km end-to-end and hiring a car or an e-bike in advance to get around is highly recommended. There are no taxi services or public transport buses available, beyond a local bus to the ferry jetty.
